Guiding Principles for Collaboration in a New Library Management System

Approved, RACL online meeting, June 23, 2015.

- The power of collaboration
- Reduce the duplication of work across the system and enable staff to work more efficiently
- Rethink workflows to gain efficiencies
- Look beyond the individual library for efficiencies (Take full advantage of shared systems)

With our shared Alma environment, one or more USG institutions with full-time cataloging staff can take on the cataloging duties for institutions without dedicated catalogers.

Takes advantage of the established practices of a large and stable cataloging department (25 FT at UGA).

- Daily original cataloging
- LC PCC training
- RDA updates
- Monthly Alma updates

Staff at smaller institutions can focus on other library tasks and local services.

- Reference and instruction
- Collection development
- Library director
- Circulation
- Other duties as assigned



Cataloging items from Co-Op Institutions

What we do:

- Add OCLC holdings
- Update and create bibliographic records in OCLC
- Update and create authority records in OCLC
- Import bibliographic records into Alma
- Add institutional holdings to existing NZ records
- Relink items in Alma as necessary
- Shelf list items






Cataloging items from Co-Op Institutions

What we do not do:


- Physical **marking** of items (property stamping, spine labeling, etc.)
- Barcode items
- Change locations in holdings records (when cataloging)
- Catalog serials and update serial holdings
- Catalog special collections materials




A little background on the statistics

"Adding a new bibliographic record to the Network Zone": a new copy of an OCLC record is imported into the NZ for the first time.


The item has arrived from ABAC attached to a suppressed record in ABAC's Institution Zone:




Then locate a matching record for the item in OCLC.




Search by OCLC number in the IZ...




...and the NZ.




Return to the suppressed record in the IZ.




Share the edited record with the Network Zone.




Import the OCLC record.




The imported record will overlay the matching NZ record.




Next, perform any local edits.



Check the call number against the shelf list of the partner institution.




Save the call number to the holdings record.




"Linking to an existing NZ record": holdings are added to a record that already exists in the Network Zone.


Again, we start a barcode search for an item from ABAC that is attached to a suppressed record in the IZ.




The next step is to locate a matching record in OCLC.




Make any necessary edits to the OCLC record and update holdings.




And search by OCLC number in the IZ...




...and the NZ.




Link the record in ABAC's Institution Zone to the Network Zone record.



Now we can see both institutions' holdings are represented in the NZ.




Finally, make any local edits, shelf list the item and update the holdings.



Why do we track these actions in particular?


• One of the two actions is somewhat less work. Maybe...

2018 totals

Background work on the project began in 2018, but the only items cataloged that year were 5 items from our first partner, Abraham Baldwin Agricultural College, in December. This small batch of test-run items let us try out the system we had envisioned and see how everything worked. In 2019, the project really got off the ground.

Atlanta Metropolitan State College: 142 items

Fort Valley State University: 222 items








515 total items were cataloged in 2019:

Abraham Baldwin Agricultural College: 87 items







Abraham Baldwin Agricultural College

- State college in Tifton, GA
 - Instructional site in Bainbridge, GA
- ~4,000 students
- ABAC Libraries
 - Baldwin Library- Tifton, 2 librarians, 2 PT assistants
 - Bainbridge Library- Bainbridge, 1 FT assistant, 2 PT assistants



Cataloging Collaboration Project

- ABAC has no dedicated cataloger
- 2018- opportunity to take part in collaboration
- Our process
 - Receive books
 - Check for network zone records
 - Begin collaboration with UGA

Benefits for ABAC

- Better expertise in cataloging
 - ABAC has no dedicated cataloger; current librarian mostly self-taught in cataloging
 - UGA brings professional cataloging
- Better use of time
 - With cataloging taken care of, librarian(s) can focus on other areas of library service
- Improves relationships between colleges
 - Provides opportunities for further collaboration

Withdrawal & Clean-up Project

- In 2020, ABAC withdrew 40,000 items from its collection
 - Due to move into renovated library with smaller stacks
 - Allowed removal of out of date and damaged items
- ABAC librarians had limited experience with handling withdrawn record clean-up with OCLC
- Due to cataloging project, pre-existing relationship with UGA made seeking out assistance even easier
