 - Evaluation team members could ask outside SME (committees/Observer team) for input **if** those folks had signed confidentiality agreement

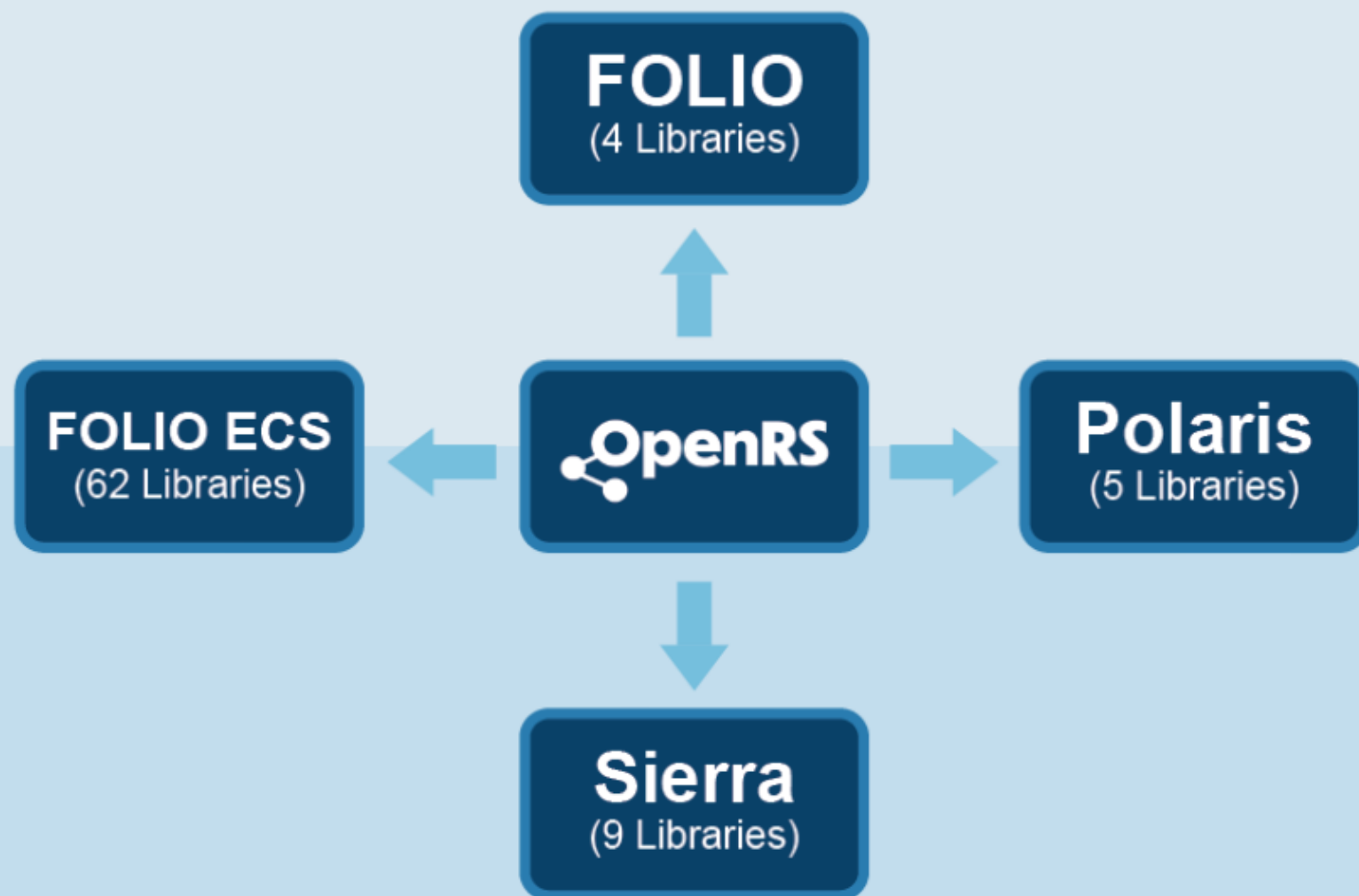

February 26	Final Test Phase START	Dress Rehearsal: MOBIUS will extract all Sierra data needed for go-live day. EBSCO will load all the data we plan to have for go-live. EDS will be reharvested; LOCATE will be reindexed. This dress rehearsal is intended to identify any issues with the process of the migration before the actual data migration.
March 1	Prospector/MOBIUS	MCO will run review files on the clusters to track what is outstanding.
March 4	Final ERM data extract	Agreements and organizations from EBSCO Admin Holdings Management. Vendor records from Sierra. Beginning of organizations reconciliation. Agreement/organization data migration. (This doesn't affect ECS (FOLIO sub-tenants) and OpenRS, but impacts PubFinder.)
March 12 - March 26	User Confirmation of Data Accuracy	MOBIUS Coordinators and Catalog User Group will review Instance, Item, and Holdings data for accuracy and to confirm migration of Sierra data.
March 15	Prospector Labels	Prospector Labels will be remove from the MOBIUS label maker (end of the day).
March 23	Prospector Reconciliation	Anything returned to Prospector but not cleared on your end should have the title, barcode, library it was borrowed from, and date returned sent to MOBIUS. This will be put into a report to be sent to Prospector. The items may then be cleared from your patron's records, you will not be liable for any losses.
March 26	Data Sign Off	MOBIUS member libraries will acknowledge the accuracy of their data with explicitly notated exceptions that will be resolved prior to the final data pull on April 19th. (MCO will provide a sign off sheet.)
Late March - Late April	Formal Online FOLIO Training	EBSCO will conduct a number of online training sessions to introduce the MOBIUS membership to using FOLIO. Training will be done in at least two "tracks" or "cohorts". The training schedule can be found HERE!

March 27	Final Test Phase END	Dress Rehearsal ends: Evaluate data in the context of the timeline.
March 28 - April 10	User Testing of FOLIO Functionality	EBSCO & MCO will provide testing prompts for Working Groups and Site Coordinators to test FOLIO functionality.
March 29	Prospector Line Haul - FINAL DAY	The last day for the Missouri-Colorado linehaul. After this date contact the MOBIUS office if you have anything to send back to Colorado.

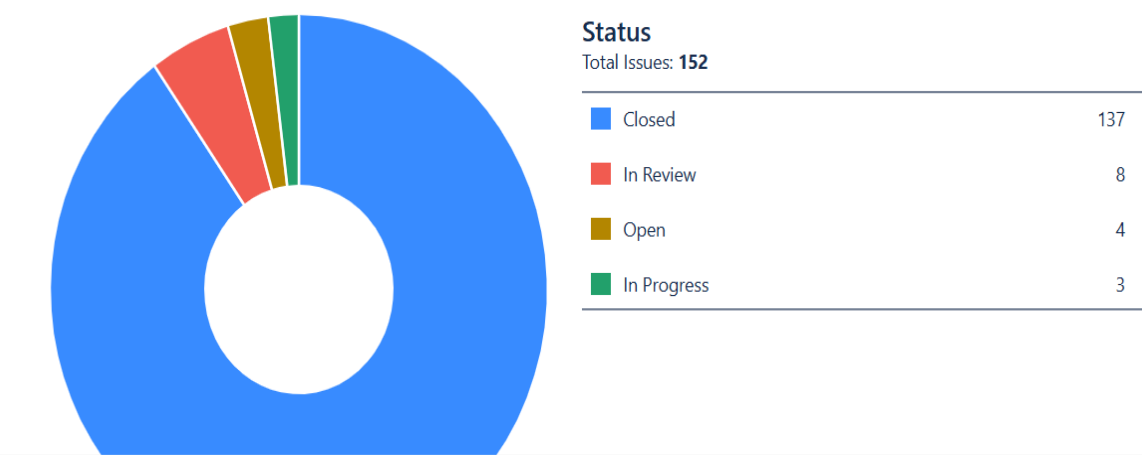

Key Project Successes

- FOLIO upgraded to Ramsons Release
- 2nd Data Migration
- User Acceptance Testing (Phase 1) Completed
- Official Trainings for Libraries Began
- 3rd Data Migration is underway

Key Project Issues

- FOLIO Ramsons Release was delayed 2-3 weeks
- Sunflower Release was delayed about a week
- UAT Testing Phase 1 has had some success while uncovering a variety of issues
- Testing by libraries is hampered by duration of data loads
- Official Project Go-Live has been delayed from 6/25 to 7/16

UAT Findings in General

- UAT Phase 1 ended Friday, April 18th
- Spent week of April 21st reviewing with testers and EBSCO
- Change is hard and a lot was expected of our testers
- Acquisitions and ERM will areas most likely to pass testing first
- OpenRS is currently unstable in our environment– current testing is not fully successful
 - Most of OPAC and Fulfillments UAT Fails are from OpenRS
- Cataloging has a variety of Fails and they are concerns with FOLIO holdings records vs. MARC holding records
- Analytics/Reporting is lacking – API work can be done to produce reports but it will be time consuming for GIL. Further investigation into LDLite is ongoing.
- Around 10 initial UAT Fails have changed to passing in the past week due to EBSCO remedies

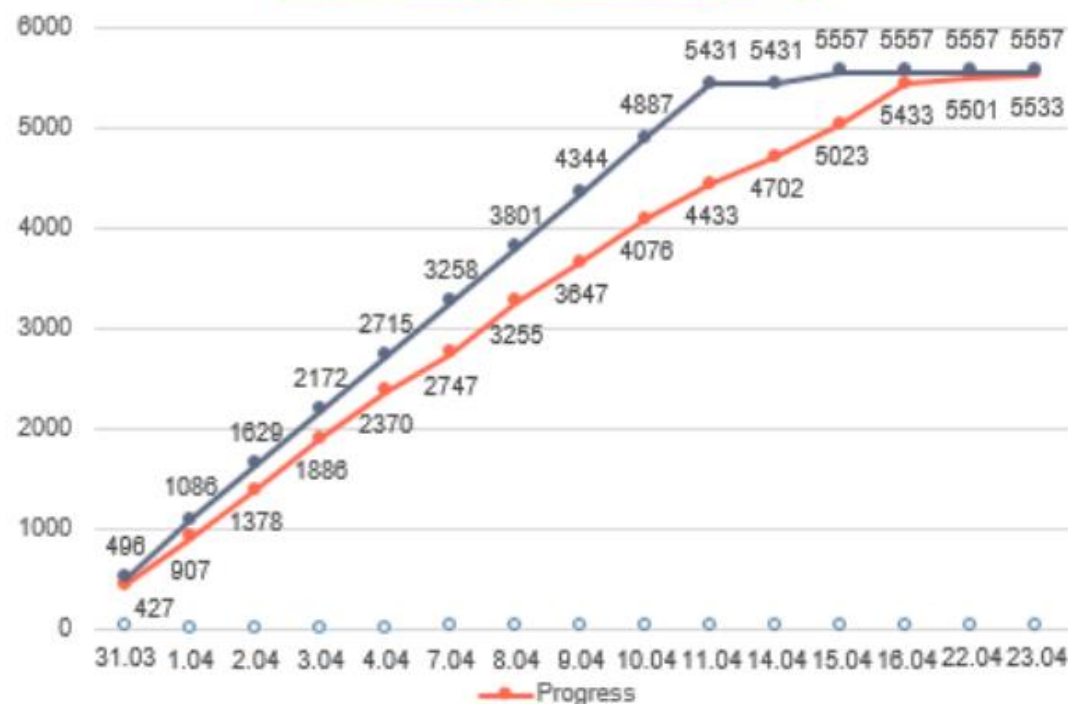
UAT Next Steps

- EBSCO has reviewed our UAT Fails and compared against successful tests in the FOLIO Sunflower Development Environment (next release)
- EBSCO confirms issues will be resolved with the Sunflower release
- The Sunflower release will be installed on our environments immediately after our third data load (dress rehearsal) around the third week of May
- UAT Phase 2 will occur from May 23rd to June 16th
- Contractually, UAT must pass 1 month before go-live

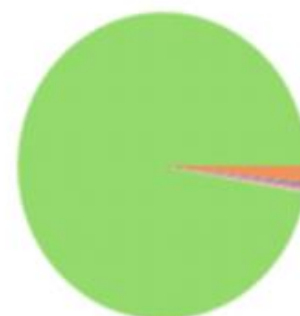
